4. Financial Report for the Senior Center

Pat Childers reviewed the deposits and expenses. Viana Dail discussed quilt sales as they are going very well. No vote to approve the report was taken.

Committee Reports

A. Center Facility Operations

Lynne McMullen reporting. The center continues to experience fluxations in cooling and heating temperatures, especially in Ste. 4. In the mornings it is especially humid when entering the room particularly after the weekends. Temperature settings were discussed, and we'll also speak to the County about what would be best to do to control the temperatures.

B. Center Programs

Lynne McMullen reported 1477 patron visits in April excluding Tax Aide visitors. Erika Mitchell said she heard the Diamond Art craft continues to do well. There was also a discussion about movies, their content and the types of movies patrons might want to see. Also in April, the TRACEN, US Coast Guard Band performed in the evening on April 23. There were about 60 participants. The band was made up of about 35 members, so we were glad there were more audience than band members. Thanks to the board members who came out. Also, the Evening Bingo with Tabb High School Band went rather well. There were about 30 patrons in attendance. The young men were helpful, spirited and brought snacks, cookies and four \$10 Food Lion gift cards for prizes. Lynne e-mailed a thank you note per their contact person. Board members were encouraged to support the following: Picnic in the Park on Friday, May 16 and a tentative rain plan. Culture Day, Wednesday, May 21 at 1pm on Filipinos in the US Armed Services with Jeff Acosta, and the Pandolfi concert on Thursday, May 29 at 2pm at St Mark Lutheran Church. Lynne McMullen talked about the Baltimore and Jamestown Settlement trips and the feedback she received, and possible ways to improve on communication to attendees, challenges with tour companies, drivers, staff. A training on trips was mentioned. Bob Santillan has some ideas for advertising in his community.

C. Health Programs

Minnie Sippio reporting today. The Healthy Aging Conference held at King of Glory Lutheran Church in Williamsburg had 150 folks, and 12 were transported on the mini-bus. Dining Club is going well. The Health Fair had about 100 in attendance. There were a couple of very last minute cancellations. Minnie Sippio was able to get "Hears to You" to fill in for hearing screenings. The vendor commented on how well the participants had done. Several participants also commented they liked the smaller number as many were able to spend more time talking with the vendors and getting more information. The Broken Heart Syndrome done by Altmeyer Funeral Homes will talk about grief on May 20 at 12:30 p.m. They are also providing 25 boxed lunches. The Sheriff's Office will bring their K-9 dog to the Center and talk about their training and service in our community. The S.A.L.T. group is sponsoring another "Car Safety Fit" event this year at Ivy Memorial Church on Monday, June 2 from 10 am to 1 pm. On Friday, June 6, Fire and Life Safety will provide a CPR/AED Awareness Seminar. Several of the board members said they would attend and asked about training for the board.


