Our goal is to ensure children and adults always have access to books, because a lack of books should never be a problem in our community.

YPDSS and YCSO planted two Little Free Libraries at 301 Goodwin Neck Road in Yorktown. One library is dedicated to children's books and the second to adult reading. A third library will be planted at the Poquoson Museum and Learning Garden. YPDSS unveiled the Little Free Libraries on April 26th during a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony. Assistant County Attorney Justin Atkins, with the help of his four-year-old daughter, Mary, and Sheriff J.D. "Danny" Diggs, cut the ribbons.

YPDSS hopes that these Little Free Libraries will inspire a love of reading and spark creativity among youth in the community. It is the goal of YPDSS to contribute to children's growth and academic experiences through this endeavor. Studies show that children with early literary experiences are more likely to be good readers.
