New Traffic Pattern on Goosley Road

Motorists who regularly use Goosley Road were greeted with a new traffic pattern Monday (11/20) at its intersection with Route 17. In conjunction with the National Park Service, VDOT implemented a new traffic pattern dedicating the left lane as left-turn-only headed north on Route 17. The right lane on Goosley Road now allows motorists to turn left onto Route 17 north, travel straight across the intersection, or turn right onto Route 17 south. The change was made to help relieve traffic congestion on Goosley Road during the Colonial Parkway bridge replacement.
