- Increase in various Building Regulation, Subdivision and Zoning Fees

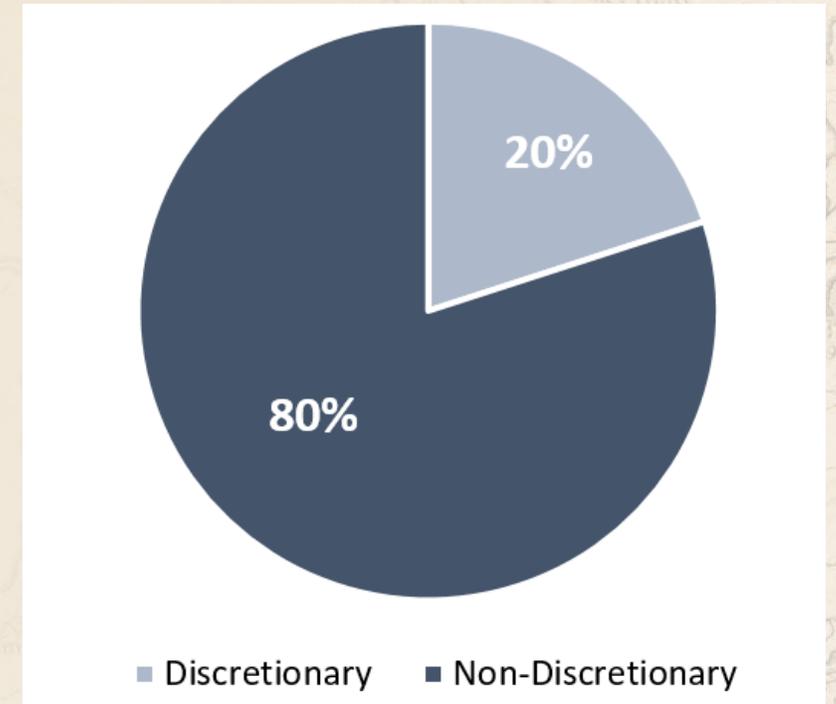

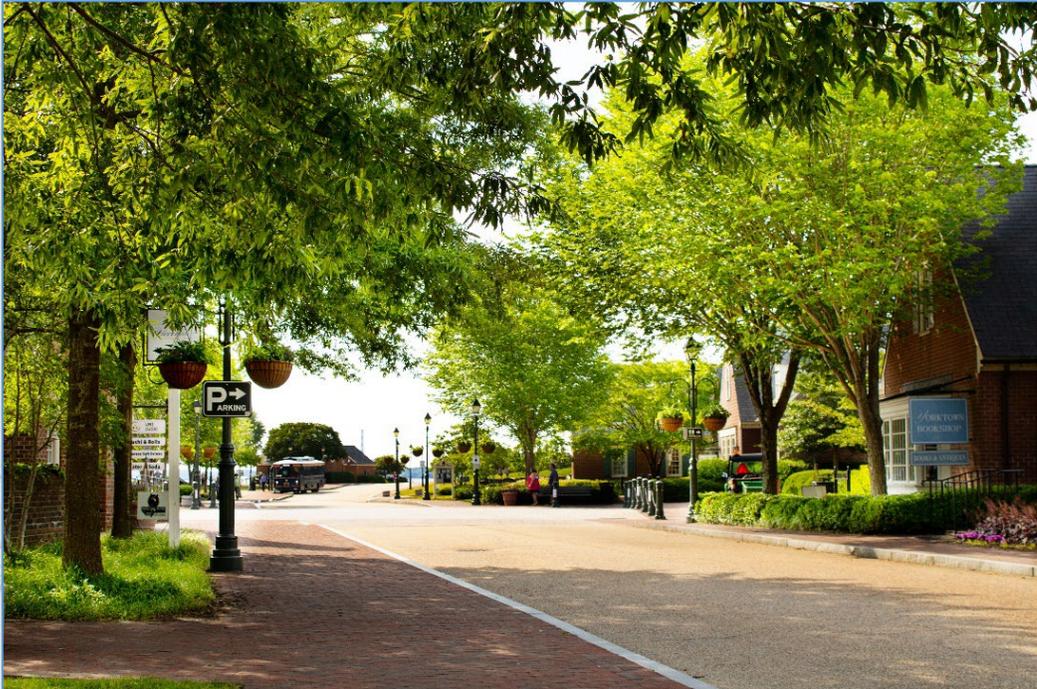
